Key deliverables include:



Supporting eight young people through the Career Ready programme, which includes providing each student with a two-year 121 mentoring partnership and a one-month paid internship in our offices.



Delivering four Career Ready masterclasses to over 150 high school students, covering both communications and networking and preparing for work sessions as part of the Career Ready Skills for Success programme.



Continuing to support Career Ready's wider charitable and strategic aims through our involvement in the Career Ready Edinburgh, Mid Lothian and East Lothian Local Authority Board.

DRIVING ENVIRONMENTAL EFFICIENCIES

The services provided through the Framework have all been designed to deliver environmental efficiencies and support our customers' wider climate and sustainability goals.

Key deliverables include:



Identifying over £3million of annualised savings and 1.607million m₃ of water reduction opportunities

through our Intelligent Water Management solution and the delivery of on-site interventions including leak detection.



Doubling our annual water efficiency fund from £50,000 to £100,000

to fund water efficiency projects across Scotland. The panel awarded funding to 13 public sector organisations spanning 16 water efficiency projects. This year's beneficiaries include National Museums Scotland, who will use their £12,500 award to conduct water conservation audits across five of their sites. Other organisations benefiting from the fund include NHS Forth Valley, who will use their funding to install water efficient urinals and taps at seven locations and West Lothian Council, who plan to reduce water usage in the region's schools.

We're absolutely delighted to have received funding from Business Stream which will help us better understand our water use so we can identify savings and work towards our sustainability goals.

In addition to delivering the activities within this document, we're also continually measuring and tracking our progress alongside international best practice standards. In January 2025, we were awarded a Gold medal from EcoVadis – the world's largest sustainability platform. Our score of 80/100 places us within the top 98th percentile of over 150,000 companies assessed worldwide.









And, in July 2024, we became the first water retailer to join the United Nations Global Compact to measure our contribution to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

Joining the UN Global Compact marks another milestone for us in our commitment to delivering our vision to make a positive difference. This membership is enabling us to better align our activities to supporting the UN Sustainable Development Goals, as well as providing opportunities for us to collaborate with others on key sustainability issues.
